Books and AnthologiesNotes: (1) An anthology is a collection of literary works of the same or differing genres. (2) An editor is someone who compiles works written by other people. (3) "Medium" refers to the method of publication: usually "print," "electronic," or "web." (4) Formatting for authors is the same, regardless of source. (4) If a piece of information is not applicable to your source, skip it.
